SHOW RULES

1. Ownership of animals - every exhibit must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor at the time

Judges interest in entries - Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the judge appointed for all classes which they wish to enter and are advised in the interests of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an exhibitor, he/she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal, he/she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.

Substitution of Judges - the Committee reserve the right in their absolute discretion to change

Any exhibit not on the Showground by the time stated in the Schedule is liable to

Entries not accepted - the Society may in their absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with

Number of entries - any number of entries may be made, unless otherwise stated in the class

Competitors may enter more than one entry per class. Where a cup is presented for the most points, an allocation system will be implemented. Should an individual receive more than one

Cancellation of Classes - In the event of there being insufficient entries the Society reserves the right, in its absolute discretion, to amalgamate or cancel classes. If the class is cancelled the entry fees will be returned. Exhibitors will be informed before the show if this is being done. Withholding Prizes - a judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit

10. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility - Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought into the Showground or for anything else arising out of the Society's Show. - 14. Removal of Exhibits livestock (other than light horses) may not be removed from the Showground until after the Grand Parade. Other exhibits may not be removed until 4.00pm on the day of the Show or in the case of on-going classes before the close of the day's events.
- 15. Any objection or dispute must be made in writing to the Secretary in the Secretary's Tent on the day of the Show, and a deposit of £10.00 made within one hour of the award being made. If in the opinion of the Committee the objection is considered to be frivolous the deposit shall be forfeited.
- 16. The Committee formed to hear any objection may at the discretion of the Chairman consist of himself and not less than 4 Stewards on the day of the Show. To be held at Secretary's marquee.

Any competitor found to falsify the age of tractors and/or ploughs on their entry form will be disqualified. Practising of opening splits or any other ploughing is not permitted and will result in disqualification.

Handling treading or shaping of furrows by hand or hand held instrument is not permitted.

Assistance to set up and remove sighting poles (maximum 3) is allowed, no other assistance will be allowed except in an emergency, class steward to be informed. Novice competitors are allowed assistance

- 8. The first and second run next to the neighbours plot will be allowed as straightening furrows and will not be judged. If there is a problem, the competitor must contact the head steward for a ruling before ploughing the first run next to their neighbour.
- 9. Last furrow to be turned towards own start (conventional).

TIMETABLE

To allow for the processing of results within a tight schedule, the society would be grateful if competitors would make every effort to start and finish ploughing on time. **10 penalty points per minute may be deducted,** at the stewards discretion.

- Weights can be used on tractors or ploughs. 2.
- 3. Adjustable stays on plough mouldboards are allowed.
- Quick entry or slotted top links are allowed. 4.
- Extended wheel axles are allowed. 5.
- 6. Screw adjustments on cross shafts are allowed.
- 7. Modified plough shares are allowed.
- Only approved manufacturers diesel engine conversions allowed. 8.
- 9. Hydraulic top links and other hydraulic rams are not allowed.
- 10. Stubble chains are not allowed.
- 11. a) **VINTAGE:** Two-piece adjustable tailpieces are not allowed. b) CLASSIC: Two-piece adjustable tailpieces are allowed.
- Drawbars with hydraulic movement not allowed. 12.

SOCIETY OF PLOUGHMAN VINTAGE & CLASSIC PLOUGHING RULES **TRACTOR** 1.

VINTAGE: In both trailing and mounted plough classes, all models of tractor must have been in production before 31st December 1959.

CLASSIC: In the classic and classic reversible class all models of tractor must have been in production before 31st December 1976. Therefore some tractors with Q cabs will now be eligble.

PLOUGHS 2.

a) **VINTAGE:** Trailing plough class -any trailing plough is eligible.

b) VINTAGE: Mounted plough classes-any mounted plough in production before 31st Dec. 1959.

- CLASSIC: Any mounted plough in production before 31st Dec. 1976, but excluding Fiskars with KH & KHN bodies, Kvernland Hydrien and Super Hydrien and Ransome/Bonning. YCN or Bonning bodies.
- **CLASSIC REVERSIBLE:** Hydraulic turnover is not allowed
- c) Any reversible plough with shear bolt or fixed leg in production before 31st December 1976 but excluding Fiskars KH and KHN, Kvernland Hydrien and Super Hydrien and Ransome/Bonning. YCN or Bonning bodies.
- d) VINTAGE: Skimmers and one piece tailpieces optional no other attachments allowed. CLASSIC: Skimmers and tailpieces optional - no other attachments allowed.
- e) Plough bodies can be raised or lowered but cannot be raised out of the ploughing position (as in Society of Ploughman rule D.)

f) All plough bodies to be used when ploughing the finish. g) Extraneous attachments that manipulate the furrows or scratches are not allowed.

GENERAL 8.

a) The first two runs next to the neighbouring competitor will not be judged, but ploughman must not mark their neighbour's ploughing with their tractor wheel. If there is a problem, the competitor must contact the head steward for a ruling before ploughing the first run nest to their neighbour. b) Rolling of furrows and scratches is **not** allowed.

c) Twin tractor wheels **not** allowed.

d) Three siting poles only allowed (one can be placed on the headland) – assistance to set up and remove is allowed. No other assistance allowed including no assistance by signal, radio contact, mobile phone or any other method.

e) Handling, shaping or treading of furrows or scratches is **not** allowed.

f) Only one tractor wheel mark allowed at the finish.

g) Only the Competitor is allowed to clean the plot of straw, stones etc.

h) Competitors must produce evidence of age of tractor if requested. i) The use of GPS technology, laser beams or any other electronic or computerised measuring devices are not allowed.

J) Any abuse of, or dispute with, an official or fellow competitor by a competitor is not acceptable. Penalty - 20 points.
