HORSE SHOW RULES

SOUTHWELL AND DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY is a Company Limited by Guarantee and shall make such rules for its Annual Ploughing Match and Show as its General Committee shall from time to time decide.

- 1. Judges interest in entries Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the judge appointed for all classes which they wish to enter and are advised in the interests of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an exhibitor, he/she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal, he/she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.
- 2. Substitution of Judges the Committee reserve the right in their absolute discretion to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced.
- 3. Any exhibit not on the Showground by the time stated in the Schedule is liable to disqualification.
- 4. Entries not accepted the Society may in their absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the non-acceptance.
- 5. Cancellation of Classes In the event of there being insufficient entries the Society reserves the right, in its absolute discretion to amalgamate or cancel classes. If the class is cancelled the entry fees will be returned. Exhibitors will be informed before the show if this is being done.
- 6. Withholding Prizes a judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
- 7. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought into the Showground or for anything else arising out of the Society's Show. EACH EXHIBITOR shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss or injury or damage done to or commissioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him or her and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. It is, therefore, the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that they have adequate public liability insurance cover in place.
- 8. Exhibitors are responsible for the safekeeping of trophies, whilst in their possession, and return of the trophies six weeks prior to the next show.
- 9. Any objection or dispute must be made in writing to the Secretary in the Secretary's Tent on the day of the Show, and a deposit of ± 10.00 made within one hour of the award being made. If in the opinion of the Committee the objection is considered to be frivolous the deposit shall be forfeited.

- 10. The Committee formed to hear any objection may at the discretion of the Chairman consist of himself and not less than 4 Stewards on the day of the Show. To be held at Secretary's marquee.
- 11. Health and Safety Regulations all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants and all horse exhibitors and competitors must comply with the above.
- 12. All Animals must be restrained by suitable headgear at all times, whilst on the showground.
- 13. Conduct of Exhibitors and their Servants Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behavior of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of any servants or agents.
- 14. The Society will not tolerate ANY form of cruelty to animals on the Showground or in the Parking areas. Any persons seen to be mistreating any animal will be disqualified, asked to leave the show immediately and maybe banned from future shows.
- 15. Exhibitors will be responsible for their animals at all times whilst on the Showground.
- 16. The Judges Decision shall be final
- 17. Hard Hats Hard Hats should be worn in all ridden classes. Any competitor choosing to compete in alternative headgear do so at THEIR OWN RISK and must sign a disclaimer to this effect in the Horse Secretary's tent.
- 18. Stallions and colts must be handled by persons of over 14 years of age and always by a competent person.
- 19. Litter It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to remove all litter (except animal bedding) accruing in their display area. Failure to do so will result in the cost incurred being recoverable from the Exhibitor.
- 20. Sale of Food and Drink is strictly prohibited unless prior authorisation has been granted in writing by the Show Secretary.
- 21. Data Protection Exhibitors names and address will be published in show publications unless the Society is specifically instructed otherwise.
- 22. Refunds Under no circumstances will Entry fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor
- 23. Cancellation Policy The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from directives, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Society, the Society will refund fees, once any administration fees have been deducted. The Society will not be under any liability for loss or damage (whether direct or indirect, consequential or otherwise) arising from or caused by a cancellation, abandonment or curtailment

Concours D'Elegance

All classes are judged on the overall picture of elegance with a strong historical influence. Inspection of the outfit and turnout of tack and horse will take place during the individual show. Manners and Ability to stand still during inspection will also be taken into account. No cantering will be required in the Go Round or during the individual show, but may be executed in your individual show if you wish. Sitting and rising trot are both acceptable. In Hand competitors will only be required to walk, entering the ring on the left rein to enable the judge to have a clear view of the costume. You may be asked about the reasons of choice / inspiration/ design of your costume.

Class 49 - Best Adult Rider ~ Competitors to be 18 years or over on the 1st January 2023
Can be ridden side saddle or astride

Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors must wear hats to current Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk. Ring 4 following on from Class 81 Class 54 The Side Saddle OPEN EOUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS OUALIFYING CLASS - Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. Southernden Farm offers a rosette to the highest placed Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette in memory of The Late Mr R Philpot is offered to the Adult Member and Manor Grange Stud Show Centre to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out. Class 55 Classical Ladies Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. NB Silks Hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges must use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs T Mitchell & Mr L Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final.
