HORSE SHOW RULES

SOUTHWELL AND DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY is a Company Limited by Guarantee and shall make such rules for its Annual Ploughing Match and Show as its General Committee shall from time to time decide.

1. Judges interest in entries - Exhibitors are particularly requested to note the name of the judge appointed for all classes which they wish to enter and are advised in the interests of all concerned not to knowingly enter an animal which has been owned or bred by the judge. Where the judge has a continuing business or financial relationship with an exhibitor, he/she should not judge an animal entered by that exhibitor whether or not the animal concerned forms part of that business relationship. Where the judge has had a past financial or breeding interest in an animal, he/she should not judge it. In such cases the Ring Steward in conjunction with the Chief Steward will make arrangements for the exhibit to be finally placed by another judge.
2. Substitution of Judges - the Committee reserve the right in their absolute discretion to change the identity of the judge for any classes from the one previously announced.
3. Any exhibit not on the Showground by the time stated in the Schedule is liable to disqualification.
4. Entries not accepted - the Society may in their absolute discretion refuse to accept any entry, the entry will be returned along with any fee and no correspondence will be entered into with regard to the non-acceptance.
5. Cancellation of Classes - In the event of there being insufficient entries the Society reserves the right, in its absolute discretion to amalgamate or cancel classes. If the class is cancelled the entry fees will be returned. Exhibitors will be informed before the show if this is being done.
6. Withholding Prizes - a judge may withhold any prize or prizes if, in his/her opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
7. Exhibitors Risk and Responsibility - Neither the SOCIETY NOR ANY OF ITS OFFICERS OR SERVANTS SHALL BE IN ANY WAY RESPONSIBLE or accountable for anything that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatsoever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or to any exhibit or to any vehicle carrying any exhibit or anything else brought into the Showground or for anything else arising out of the Society's Show. EACH EXHIBITOR shall be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss or injury or damage done to or commissioned by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him or her and shall indemnify the Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto. It is, therefore, the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that they have adequate public liability insurance cover in place, and proof of this should be available to the Society, if requested.

8. Exhibitors are responsible for the safekeeping of trophies, whilst in their possession, and return of the trophies six weeks prior to the next show.
9. Any objection or dispute must be made in writing to the Secretary in the Secretary's Tent on the day of the Show, and a deposit of £10.00 made within one hour of the award being made. If in the opinion of the Committee the objection is considered to be frivolous the deposit shall be forfeited.
10. The Committee formed to hear any objection may at the discretion of the Chairman consist of himself and not less than 4 Stewards on the day of the Show. To be held at Secretary's marquee.
11. Health and Safety Regulations all livestock exhibitors/stock attendants and all horse exhibitors and competitors must comply with the above.
12. All Animals must be restrained by suitable headgear at all times, whilst on the showground.
13. Conduct of Exhibitors and their Servants - Exhibitors shall be responsible for the behavior of their servants or agents and for the consequences of any misconduct of any servants or agents.
14. The Society will not tolerate ANY form of cruelty to animals on the Showground or in the Parking areas. Any persons seen to be mistreating any animal will be disqualified, asked to leave the show immediately and maybe banned from future shows.
15. Exhibitors will be responsible for their animals at all times whilst on the Showground.
16. The Judges Decision shall be final
17. Hard Hats – Hard Hats should be worn in all ridden classes. Any competitor choosing to compete in alternative headgear do so at THEIR OWN RISK and must sign a disclaimer to this effect in the Horse Secretary's tent.
18. Stallions and colts – must be handled by persons of over 14 years of age and always by a competent person.
19. Litter - It is the responsibility of Exhibitors to remove all litter accruing in their display / parking area. Failure to do so will result in the cost incurred being recoverable from the Exhibitor.
20. Sale of Food and Drink - is strictly prohibited unless prior authorisation has been granted in writing by the Show Secretary.
21. Data Protection - Exhibitors names and address will be published in show publications unless the Society is specifically instructed otherwise.
22. Refunds – Under no circumstances will Entry fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an Exhibitor
23. Cancellation Policy – The Society reserves the right to postpone, cancel, abandon or curtail the Show. Where such decision arises from directives, happenings or circumstances outside the control of the Society, the Society will refund fees, once any administration fees have been deducted. The Society will not be under any liability for loss or damage (whether direct or indirect, consequential or otherwise) arising from or caused by a cancellation, abandonment or curtailment

London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes

These classes are affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (B.S.P.S.), and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in B.S.P.S. classes, whether or not members of the B.S.P.S. are subject to the Rules of the B.S.P.S., including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the B.S.P.S. Qualifier:

The following classes are qualifiers for the London International Horse Show 2024

Open to members and non-members for the qualifying classes but will need to join within seven days of qualifying to enter the Final or the qualification will pass down the line. The winning pony in each class will qualify, qualification will go no lower than 3rd place.

Ponies must be plaited, body protectors compulsory for jumping phase.

Entry Fee - £25 per class (includes LIHS Levy) to be entered before Sunday 15th September 2024.

Prize Money 1st - £15, 2nd - £10, 3rd - £5, 4th - £3

Class 9 **Cradle Stakes**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, pony not exceeding 122cms. Rider not to have attained their 11th Birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

Class 10 **Nursery Stakes**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, pony not exceeding 133cms. Rider not to have attained their 13th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

CH 3 **Championship – The SPM Cup will be presented to the winner**, first and second prizewinners from classes 9 and 10 are eligible to enter.

The following classes are unaffiliated and not qualifiers.

Ponies may be shown plaited or M&M welcome in natural state.

Class 11 **Junior Training Stakes**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, pony not exceeding 128cms. Rider not to have attained their 12th Birthday before the 1st January in the current year. Height of fences will be 40 cms. Lead rein ponies welcome, will be judged separately.

Class 12 **Working Hunter Pony**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, Pony not exceeding 148 cms. Height of fences 60 cms.

Class 13 **Working Hunter Pony**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, Pony not exceeding 148 cms. Height of fences 70 cms.

Class 14 **Working Hunter Pony**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years and over, Pony not exceeding 148 cms. Height of fences 80 cms.

CH 4 **Championship – ‘THE EVENTIDE CUP’** will be presented to the winner, all first and second prizewinners in classes 11 - 14 are eligible to enter the Championship

- Class 24 **CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE** – The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse and rider. Attention may be paid to the rider's personal appearance, but detailed inspection of rider or tack is not required. Fancy dress or period costume is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot and canter. No individual show is required, but the Judge may ask groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. A Special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. **N.B.** Silk hats are permitted to be worn by Adults IN THIS CLASS AT ANY TIME OF DAY. Juniors **must** wear hats to current Safety standards or above for this class. Adult riders not wearing such hats do so at their own risk.
- Class 25 **The Side Saddle OPEN EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFYING CLASS** – Run under SSA Rules defined in the current Member's Handbook. Open to SSA Members and Non-Members. Members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd Adult and 3rd Junior places and SSA Championship Points. **Southernden Farm** offers a rosette to the highest placed Junior Member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. A rosette in memory of **The Late Mr R Philpot** is offered to the Adult Member and **Just So Elegant Side Saddle** to the Junior Member, judged to be the best turned out.
- Class 26 **CLASSICAL LADIES** Open to SSA Adult Members and Non-members, aged 18 and over on January 1st of the current year, riding side saddle, on horses exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be judged 25% conformation and action, 25% manners & way of going, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider, by a SHBGB, BSHA or SSA Panel Judge. Judges may request a short show, but will not ride exhibits; horses will not be stripped. Traditional habits must be worn. Fancy Dress and Period Costumes NOT permitted. NB Silks Hats are permitted to be worn in this class AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY. Judges must use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. In the event of previous qualification, this may be passed down to fourth place. Special rosettes are offered by Mrs T Mitchell & Mr L Mitchell to the winner and if the winner has already qualified, a second rosette is awarded with the Qualification Card. Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. The four highest placed **Riding Horse, Hack** (Not ex 160 cm) **Cob** or **Hunter**, Mare or Gelding, 4 years or over, ridden by a SSA Adult Member qualify for the current year's BSHA Championship Show Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship, and if already qualified the ticket will go to the next highest placed horse down to 5th place. Combinations qualifying after the current year's BSHA Championship may carry forward the qualification, to the following year. **SSA Members** who qualify for **The Mears Ladies Show Horse Championship**, will not be required to join BSHA in order to compete in any **Side Saddle class** at the **BSHA National Championship Show**. If the BSHA Championship Show entries have closed at the time of qualification, competitors will not be charged a late entry fee for the **Championship**.

Class 27

CONTEMPORARY LADIES SIDE SADDLE

Open to SSA Adult and Junior Members and Non-members riding a Native, Part Bred, Heavy or World Breed horse/pony side saddle. To be judged 25% suitability of horse/pony for rider, 25% manners and way of going for type, 25% rider, and 25% turnout of horse & rider. Conformation will not be taken into consideration. The Judge will request a short show. Traditional habits must be worn. N.B. Silk hats are permitted to be worn in this class **AT ANY TIME OF THE DAY**. Judges are requested to use the mark sheet provided. The highest placed horse/rider combination qualifies for the Final to be held at the National Side Saddle Show. One special rosette and the qualification card will be given to the qualifying combination at each show, this may not always be the winner; if the winner has already qualified they may be passed down to fourth place. Qualifiers kindly sponsored by Southernden Side Saddles Qualifying combinations are required to become Full Members of the SSA 21 days prior to the National Side Saddle Show or as soon as possible if qualified after that date to be eligible to compete at the Final. Combinations qualifying between one National Side Saddle Show and the next may carry forward the qualification, for that year only. Competitors must wear a hat to current Safety Standard or above.

BEST HORSE OR PONY RIDDEN SIDE SADDLE Open to horses and ponies 4 years old or over, conformation & manners will be taken into consideration; horses/ponies will not be stripped. A rosette will be awarded to the highest placed Adult and Junior Members of the SSA carrying their current Championship Points Cards. The Highest placed **coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16yrs or over** (who has not already qualified) receives a **Special Rosette** and qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the **CHAPS Championship Show**. Open to any type of exhibit. Riders/Owners need not be a member, or their exhibits registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the Rider / Owner must be a showing member and their horse / pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Lead Rein competitors are eligible for this.
